Website Design and Coding for Local High School Students 12-Week Program

Did you know the average salary for a web app developer in Georgia is \$76,000 per year? Now is your chance to get a head start and learn what it takes to be one!

We're selecting 20 students to learn how to create a website from beginning to end that works across all device types. Those selected will learn the basics of web design and coding with HTML, CSS, and JavaScript.

Each student will be matched to work on a local business website to get hands-on soft-skills and entrepreneurial experience.

To participate, you must have a Windows laptop or MacBook available during class times and to work on your projects in between class time. Classes will be held at Trinity Chapel Life Center located at 4665 Macland Rd, Powder Springs, GA on Saturdays from 10AM to noon.

All training is mandatory to attend if you're selected.
